Submitting short articles for the ALIUS Blog

Word limit: 500-3000 words (without footnotes and bibliography)

Style for the bibliography: [APA style](#) (6th ed.)

Language: American English

We welcome quality contributions to the blog discussing the diversity of conscious states within an empirically-oriented, naturalistic framework (see [this page](#)). Contributions may come from anthropology, neuroscience, neuropharmacology, psychology, psychiatry, philosophy and computer science (non-exhaustive list).

Regardless of the author's disciplinary background, contribution should directly discuss conscious experience and relate empirical work to current issues in consciousness research. For example, a neuroscientist should not merely present fMRI data, but should also discuss how these are related to participants' first-person reports; likewise, an anthropologist should not merely describe a ritual, but should also provide data as to what it is like to partake in this ritual and discuss the relevance of these results for the science of consciousness, etc.

Submissions endorsing psychoanalytic, parapsychological, outlandish metaphysical or new age claims will not be accepted, in line with ALIUS' commitment to a naturalistic and evidence-based approach to consciousness research.
